General Comments:-

- 1) 3 years is a long time to not have found. There are fewer jobs out there but there are still jobs out there so how can someone have not found work for three years when theres a job centre to help.
- 2) it is hard enough to live on jobseekers allowance and on any other benefits without reducing it anymore
- 3) We give away too much to the bone idle, enough is enough.
- 4) It will stop people relying on long term benefits and look for work. It is unfair that those who bother to pay their way have to face increases because of those who can't be bothered.
- I think most people (including myself) could afford a little more than 10% of the total. I think 15% is perfectly acceptable. Im on esa and would be willing to pay 15% but 20% would start to hurt.

I think even if the funding remains the same that it should goto 15% and the extra be used to fund any further cuts the following year

- 6) It should be reduced to 1 year!
- 7) I am a support worker for the disabled, i know of many cases where this charge has caused genuine hardship. If you want to know who is genuine, as atos does not seem to know, its a very simple procedure. Ask their neighbours!!!
- You are discriminating against the poor and vunerable in society with these rules. [Disabled]
- 9) I feel you are persecuting people that have moved to Tendring from other areas of the country in the last 5 years. I understand that the council need to make changes but we should all be treated the same whether we have lived here 1 year or 50 years. I feel it would be better if instead of making some people pay full council tax make everyone pay half.

- 10) I am struggling to do this questionaire because the questions are loaded and an assumption is made "However, for people of working age, the Council has had to design a scheme that is less generous than the previous Council Tax Benefit scheme." that is untrue. The Council have decided to design a scheme that results in no increase in Council tax.
- 11) Everyone can afford to pay something.
- 12) I have concerns about the residency rules. My view is it should be broader to recognise the wider value of families returning to the area to access support networks. For example children / grandchildren who move away for marriage but may need to return to their home area. I think people should qualify if they can evidence a family connection to the area.
- 13) I believe that 3 years would be a fairer length of residency; most households within that time would have made a valid financial contribution to TDC. However, now we have 5 years I do not believe we should lower the limit.I think we should make further stipulations to this rule.
- 14) As a result of the compulsory council tax payments for all working age claimants, the actual JSA received as a result is now an average of £64.70 per week (down from weekly JSA of the "statutory" £71.70). We have no choice in paying as this is a tax. This is fundamentally not the case with other outgoings such as gas and electricity, as we have the choice of seeking a cheaper tariff, or not having any utilities accounts at all. Council tax imposition is wrong for those whose only income is JSA, ESA and other similar weekly paid benefits.
- 15) I think the 25% reduction of CTS should have it's time limit reduced to 2 years or more and for those that are willing to 'fail to sign' to just start a new claim before the three years is up should lose their right to have this gap in their award it should be continuious unless the gap is for a minimum of 6 weeks
- 16) Help should be more concentrated in those who work and try and earn a living, not those who sit on there arses and not work cos they cant be asked!!! My family would be better off on benefits than working, not that we would live that way because we have pride in ourselfs but if these sorts of benefits and support were more aimed at those trying to help themselfs than those who dont more people would have to find a job!!!!
- 17) All income should be taken into account and everyone should have to pay the same for council services and leisure centre use age I.e gym useage
- 18) That any changes imposed should be fair and equal.
- 19) It is not practically conceivable to keep removing money from those who have the least, especially at a time of increasing costs.
- 20) What is considered a low wage to qualify for LCTS
- 21) My next door neighbour doesn't work, nor does his wife, has three kids and spends his life playing his games console, drives a newer car than me and doesn't have to get up early and arrive home late to pay his way. Should I or my taxes be paying for his easy life....NO!
