A.5 <u>LIMITED RE-DESIGNATION OF PROHIBITED STREET TRADING STREETS TO STREET TRADING CONSENT STREETS IN CLACTON TOWN CENTRE</u>

(Report prepared by Simon Harvey)

PART 1 – KEY INFORMATION

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

To enable the Committee to consider the results of the public consultation on the proposal to allow a limited re-designation of Prohibited Street Trading Streets to Street Trading Consent Streets within Clacton Town centre in accordance with the requirements of Section 2 paragraphs (2) to (13) of Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 for the area indicated on plan of this locality which is attached to this report as **Appendix 1**.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The success of the Continental Market held in the Town Square for four days in July
 of last year and again at Christmas has highlighted a need to re-designate the streets
 which encompass the Town Square locality (see Appendix 1) from Prohibited Street
 Trading Streets to Consent Streets
- This measure will enable the Council to be able to positively promote such occasional market events in the future.
- The market attracted many additional visitors to the town and created a vibrant and colourful atmosphere for residents, visitors and businesses alike and the Council wishes to put into place the proper mechanism to allow and promote those markets that enhance the town centre.
- At its meeting of the 31 October 2013 the Licensing Committee approved a resolution to allow a re-designation of a limited area of Clacton Town Centre from a Prohibited Street Trading Street to a Consent Street and advertise that resolution to invite public consultation on the proposal.
- The Committee Members is now asked to consider the result of that public consultation and give their final approval for the re-designation of the Town Centre area shown under Appendix 1 of this report.

RECOMMENDATION(S)

It is recommended that:

- a) The Committee considers the result of the public consultation and agrees to re-designate those streets detailed in the public notice shown as Appendix 2 of this report from prohibited trading streets to street trading consent streets;
- b) A final notice of intent to re-designate the streets as detailed in Appendix 4 of this report is published in a local newspaper in accordance with the requirements of Section 2 paragraphs (2) to (13) of Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982.

PART 2 - IMPLICATIONS OF THE DECISION

FINANCE, OTHER RESOURCES AND RISK

Finance and other resources

There will be a cost to the licensing service in staff time and in the cost of publication of the notices in a local newspaper. However these costs can be met from within existing budgets and resources.

Risk Management

There is a risk to the Council's reputation in potentially allowing market or street trading activities to take place in prohibited street trading streets. Re-designating these streets to consent street status will negate any such risk.

LEGAL

To allow street trading to properly take place in a prohibited street trading area the Council needs to re-designate the streets, all forecourts, roads, footways or other areas adjacent to these streets for a distance of 10 metres which the public have access to without payment as detailed in Appendix 1 of this report from their current status as prohibited street trading streets to consent street trading streets.

Part of the process of re-designation is the publication of a public notice in a local newspaper which invites representations for or against the proposed re-designation. Any representations received must be considered by the Licensing Committee before any decision to re-designate is finally taken.

OTHER IMPLICATIONS

Consideration has been given to the implications of the proposed decision in respect of the following and any significant issues are set out below.

Re-designation of the streets in question would ensure that all street or market trading activities in this locality is undertaken in accordance within current legislation.

CONSULTATION/PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

The resolution of intent to re-designate from prohibited streets to consent streets was advertised in the public notice section of a local newspaper circulating in the area and gave not less than 28 days from the date of publication of the notice for representations to be made in relation to the draft resolution and also consulted on in accordance with the requirements of Section 2 paragraphs (2) to (13) of Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. **See attached as Appendix 2.**

A copy of the notice detailing the draft resolution of intent was served on the Chief Officer of Police for the area.

While not necessary under the Act to do so, for transparency and partnership, a copy of the notice was sent to the Highway Authority and also to Ward Councillors and the Clacton Town Centre Partnership. **See attached as Appendix 3.**

A final resolution by the Committee of its notice of intent to re-designate the streets must be published in a local newspaper in accordance with the requirements of Section 2 paragraphs (2) to (13) of Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. A draft of this notice is attached to this report as Appendix 4.

The resolution must be advertised for two consecutive weeks in a local newspaper and the first of these publications must not be later than 28 days before the date specified in the resolution for the re-designation to come into force.

Following this process, the area described in the notice will become a designated Consent Street Trading area.

PART 3 - SUPPORTING INFORMATION

BACKGROUND

Street trading in Clacton on Sea is regulated and controlled by the designation of the streets shown under Appendix 1 of this report as Prohibited Street Trading Streets. The full list of current Prohibited and Consent Street Trading Streets is shown **attached as Appendix 5.**

The relevant legislation to regulate and control street trading is Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982.

Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 is an adoptive piece of legislation which was adopted by this Council by the Control and Protection Committee at its meeting of the 13 July 1983.

Designating a Prohibited Street means in effect that no street trading is allowed in that location and anyone doing so could be committing an offence which they could be prosecuted for.

The interpretation of 'street' in the Act includes 'any road, footway, beach or other area to which the public have access to without payment'.

Street trading consent streets are generally more suitable to cover infrequent types of trading such as the occasional continental market for example and therefore provides a Council with a more flexible system of regulation and control.

CURRENT POSITION

At their Committee meeting of the 31 October 2013, Members resolved to publish and consult on a draft notice of intent to re-designate the area from the junction of Jackson Road/Rosemary Road to the junction of Rosemary Road/Station Road to the junction of Station Road/West Avenue to the junction of West Avenue/Jackson Road to the junction of Jackson Road/Rosemary Road and the remainder of Pier Avenue up to the junction of Marine Parade Clacton on Sea and all forecourts, roads, footways or other areas adjacent to these streets for a distance of 10 metres which the public have access to without payment from their current status as Prohibited Street Trading streets to Consent Street Trading streets. A plan of this locality is attached to this report as Appendix 1.

The period of time for the consultation of the draft public notice and the proposal to redesignate the above area has expired.

A copy of the first public notice of intent published is shown in this report (under Appendix 2) and copies of the accompanying consultation letters are attached to this report as **Appendix 3.**


There were no responses received to the public notice or to the consultation letters which would imply that there were no objections or strong feelings raised against the proposal.



While not part of any formal statutory consultation, the Council would nevertheless welcome any comment that the Clacton Town Partnership may have on this proposal which will be reported back to the Licensing Committee before it makes any final decision on whether to formally redesignate the above areas from their current status as a Prohibited Street Trading areas to Consent Street Trading areas.
