ENFORCEMENT QUARTERLY PERFORMANCE REPORT

1. Background

This report has been compiled to inform the Committee of the Enforcement Service's performance over the past three months.

The first half of 2012 has been a busy period with the Service investigating 290 cases. If this level of complaint notification continues throughout the year, the Service will experience a reduction in investigations from 700 to 600 a year. It is normal however, for the number of complaints to rise during the summer months.

7. Appeals Determined

Of the appeals lodged against the Council's decision to issue a notice, there have been none determined this quarter. The Council's annual appeal statistics for 2011 was a healthy 88.9% success rate, but so far this year our success continues to be 100%.

8. <u>Prosecutions</u>

Over this quarter the Council has mounted only one prosecution in the local Magistrate's Courts.

9. <u>Warrants</u>

In June the Council obtained a warrant from Colchester Magistrates' Court, under Section 196 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, as amended, to access a property in Mistley following the owner's failure to secure compliance with the terms of an enforcement notice served in April 2009. The warrant was exercised on the 28th of the month.

10. <u>Conclusions</u>

The number of complaints received in the first half of the year shows a slight fall in the level of workload for the enforcement service. However, this has been offset by the additional work required to the service of the 34 Breach of Condition Notices at Point Clear Bay, St Osyth, which allow until November 2013 for compliance.
