### Status of the Local Plan

The 'development plan' for Tendring is the 2007 'adopted' Local Plan. Paragraph 213 of the NPPF (2018) allows local planning authorities to give due weight to adopted albeit outdated policies according to their degree of consistency with the policies in the NPPF. Paragraph 48 of the NPPF also allows weight to be given to policies in emerging plans according to their stage of preparation, the extent to which there are unresolved objections to relevant policies and the degree of consistency with national policy. As of 16th June 2017, the emerging Local Plan for Tendring is the Tendring District Local Plan 2013-2033 and Beyond Publication Draft.

Section 1 of the Local Plan (which sets out the strategy for growth across North Essex including Tendring, Colchester and Braintree) was examined in January and May 2018 and the Inspector's initial findings were published in June 2018. They raise concerns, very specifically, about the three 'Garden Communities' proposed in north Essex along the A120 designed to deliver longer-term sustainable growth in the latter half of the plan period and beyond 2033. Further work is required to address the Inspector's concerns and the North Essex Authorities are considering how best to proceed.

With more work required to demonstrate the soundness of the Local Plan, its policies cannot yet carry the full weight of adopted policy, however they can carry some weight in the determination of planning applications. The examination of Section 2 of the Local Plan will progress once matters in relation to Section 1 have been resolved. Where emerging policies are particularly relevant to a planning application and can be given some weight in line with the principles set out in paragraph 48 of the NPPF, they will be considered and, where appropriate, referred to in decision notices. In general terms however, more weight will be given to policies in the NPPF and the adopted Local Plan.

## 5. Officer Appraisal

### **Proposal**

This application seeks planning permission for a single storey side extension, single storey rear extension, and the conversion of the integral garage of a detached bungalow within the development boundary of Aingers Green.

### Design and Appearance

The application site is a corner plot at the entrance to the Paddocks. The proposed side extension will be visible from the highway, but relates well to the host dwelling. Ample open space is retained towards the junction to prevent the extension from dominating the site or appearing cramped. The rear extension will be visible from further into The Paddocks cul-de-sac, due to the adjacent dwelling's set back from the road. However, it will not appear prominent over the tall close boarded fence, and adequate private amenity space is retained. The garage conversion will not affect the character of the dwelling, and adequate parking space is retained to the front of the dwelling.

### Impact on Neighbours

As the application site is a corner plot, and the adjacent neighbour is set back considerably further from the highway than the host dwelling, no aspects of the proposal will be close enough to neighbouring dwellings to impact daylight or outlook. As the proposal is only single storey, there will be no impact on neighbouring privacy.

#### Other Considerations

Great Bentley Parish Council has made no comment on the application.

No other letters of representation have been received.

#### Conclusion

In the absence of material harm as a result of the proposed development, this application is recommended for approval.
