Status of the Local Plan

The 'development plan' for Tendring is the 2007 'adopted' Local Plan. Paragraph 213 of the NPPF (2018) allows local planning authorities to give due weight to adopted albeit outdated policies according to their degree of consistency with the policies in the NPPF. Paragraph 48 of the NPPF also allows weight to be given to policies in emerging plans according to their stage of preparation, the extent to which there are unresolved objections to relevant policies and the degree of consistency with national policy. As of 16th June 2017, the emerging Local Plan for Tendring is the Tendring District Local Plan 2013-2033 and Beyond Publication Draft.

Section 1 of the Local Plan (which sets out the strategy for growth across North Essex including Tendring, Colchester and Braintree) was examined in January and May 2018 and the Inspector's initial findings were published in June 2018. They raise concerns, very specifically, about the three 'Garden Communities' proposed in north Essex along the A120 designed to deliver longer-term

sustainable growth in the latter half of the plan period and beyond 2033. Further work is required to address the Inspector's concerns and the North Essex Authorities are considering how best to proceed.

With more work required to demonstrate the soundness of the Local Plan, its policies cannot yet carry the full weight of adopted policy, however they can carry some weight in the determination of planning applications. The examination of Section 2 of the Local Plan will progress once matters in relation to Section 1 have been resolved. Where emerging policies are particularly relevant to a planning application and can be given some weight in line with the principles set out in paragraph 48 of the NPPF, they will be considered and, where appropriate, referred to in decision notices. In general terms however, more weight will be given to policies in the NPPF and the adopted Local Plan.

5. Officer Appraisal (including Site Description and Proposal)

Proposal

This application seeks permission for the erection of a single storey rear conservatory to a bungalow within the development boundary.

Assessment

Design and Appearance

The proposal will be sited to the rear however as a result of the open space between the application dwelling and the neighbour to the north the conservatory with be publicly visible within Lymington Avenue.

Whilst publicly visible the proposal will be set back sufficiently from the front of the site and will be partially screened by the host dwelling and existing fencing which will prevent it from appearing prominently within the streetscene.

The proposal is of an appropriate size and design to the existing house and will be primarily glazed with a brick plinth. The brick will match that of the existing house. Whilst the glazing will not be consistent with the host dwelling as the proposal will be sited to the rear with a minimal impact on the streetscene the use of this material would not be harmful to the existing dwellings overall appearance or character.

The site is of a sufficient size to accommodate the proposal and still retain sufficient private amenity space.

Impact to Neighbours

The proposal will not result in a loss of residential amenities to the neighbour to the north as it will be sited sufficiently away from the neighbouring boundary and screened by the existing host dwellings outbuilding and boundary fencing.

Sited to the south is the attached neighbouring semi-detached bungalow 5 Lymmington Avenue. Sited between these neighbours is an existing boundary fence. As a result of the orientation of the dwellings the proposal will not result in a loss of light to this neighbour. Whilst the proposal will result in a loss of privacy and outlook to this neighbour the conservatory will be sited 1.3m from this neighbour and partially screened by the existing boundary fencing. It is also noted that the fence could be increased to 2m under permitted development which would screen more of the proposal including the windows which will face into this neighbouring dwellings rear garden. It is therefore considered that the loss of privacy and outlook in this instance are not so significant to refuse planning permission upon.

Other considerations

Clacton is non parished and therefore no comments are required. No letters of representation have been received.

Conclusion

In the absence of material harm resulting from the proposed development the application is recommended for approval.
