Summary of Request for money:	This project seeks to replicate the Great Bentley wellbeing hub approach to prevention and early intervention for improving children’s mental health and wellbeing in a number of other primary schools across Tendring and Colchester and to robustly evaluate its impact and effectiveness. The approach comprises a whole school ethos and universal support for children’s mental health and wellbeing, and targeted early intervention of structured support within a wellbeing hub. The project will expand the offer of support to parents and will build and strengthen links to the voluntary and community sector to increase awareness of and access to further support for the child and family. An important output of this project will be the creation of a toolkit containing all the necessary information to allow primary schools to replicate this approach at scale.
