Status of the Local Plan

The 'development plan' for Tendring is the 2007 'adopted' Local Plan. Paragraph 213 of the NPPF (2019) allows local planning authorities to give due weight to adopted albeit outdated policies according to their degree of consistency with the policies in the NPPF. Paragraph 48 of the NPPF also allows weight to be given to policies in emerging plans according to their stage of preparation, the extent to which there are unresolved objections to relevant policies and the degree of consistency with national policy. As of 16th June 2017, the emerging Local Plan for Tendring is the Tendring District Local Plan 2013-2033 and Beyond Publication Draft.

Section 1 of the Local Plan (which sets out the strategy for growth across North Essex including Tendring, Colchester and Braintree) was examined in January and May 2018 and the Inspector's initial findings were published in June 2018. They raise concerns, very specifically, about the three 'Garden Communities' proposed in north Essex along the A120 designed to deliver longer-term sustainable growth in the latter half of the plan period and beyond 2033. Further work is required to address the Inspector's concerns and the North Essex Authorities are considering how best to proceed.

With more work required to demonstrate the soundness of the Local Plan, its policies cannot yet carry the full weight of adopted policy, however they can carry some weight in the determination of planning applications. The examination of Section 2 of the Local Plan will progress once matters in relation to Section 1 have been resolved. Where emerging policies are particularly relevant to a planning application and can be given some weight in line with the principles set out in paragraph 48 of the NPPF, they will be considered and, where appropriate, referred to in decision notices. In general terms however, more weight will be given to policies in the NPPF and the adopted Local Plan.

5. Officer Appraisal (including Site Description and Proposal)

Application site

The application site is located to the east of Chapel Lane, outside the development boundary of Ardleigh. It serves a detached dwelling constructed of brick with a slate roof. The front of the site is gravelled for parking which wraps round to the north side of the property where a garage is situated. The rear is mainly laid to lawn with close boarding fencing on the boundaries.

Proposal

This application seeks planning permission for a part single storey and part 1.5 storey rear extension. The proposal will measure a maximum depth of 5.1m, 9.5m wide - extending nearly the entire width of the existing rear elevation, and will have part monopitched roof to the south side of the host dwelling and will also have a part pitched roof with a maximum height of 6.7m. It will be constructed of brick with a slate roof.

Assessment

The main considerations of this application are the design and the impact upon residential amenity.

Policy Considerations

The adopted Tendring District Local Plan (2007) Policies QL9, QL10 and QL11 seek to ensure that all new development makes a positive contribution to the quality of the local environment and protects or enhances local character, and the development will not have a materially damaging impact on the privacy, daylight and other amenities of occupiers of nearby property. Policy SPL3 of the Tendring District Local Plan 2013-2033 and Beyond Publication Draft (June 2017) carries forward the sentiments of these saved policies.

Design and Appearance

The proposed rear extension is considered to be of a scale and nature appropriate to the site and the surrounding area. The use of matching materials will blend the development with the host dwelling. The development will not be visible from Chapel Lane, therefore will not have any impact upon the street scene.

The proposed development is therefore considered to be in keeping with the host dwelling and is acceptable in design terms.

Impact on Residential Amenity

The rear extension is a distance of 0.9m to The Willows Chapel Lane and will be a distance of 10.7m to Rosella Chapel Lane. Although the distance to The Willows Chapel Lane is 0.9m and this fails policy HG9 (Tendring District Local Plan 2007, Side Isolation) the position and orientation of 2 Milton Road, is of a distance where it will not be affected and therefore would not result in any material harm to the neighbours. It is also important to note that the proposal would have a maximum height of 3.8m to the south side. Rosella Chapel Lane is of a sufficient distance and will be screened by the existing garage. Due to this there will be no significant loss of light or overlooking.

Other Considerations

Ardleigh Parish Council has not commented on the planning application. No further letters of representation have been received.

Conclusion

It is considered that the proposed development is consistent with the National and Local Plan Policies identified above, and in the absence of any material harm resulting from the development, the application is recommended for approval.
