Status of the Local Plan

The 'development plan' for Tendring is the 2007 'adopted' Local Plan. Paragraph 213 of the NPPF (2019) allows local planning authorities to give due weight to adopted albeit outdated policies according to their degree of consistency with the policies in the NPPF. Paragraph 48 of the NPPF also allows weight to be given to policies in emerging plans according to their stage of preparation, the extent to which there are unresolved objections to relevant policies and the degree of consistency with national policy. As of 16th June 2017, the emerging Local Plan for Tendring is the Tendring District Local Plan 2013-2033 and Beyond Publication Draft.

Section 1 of the Local Plan (which sets out the strategy for growth across North Essex including Tendring, Colchester and Braintree) was examined in January and May 2018 and the Inspector's initial findings were published in June 2018. They raise concerns, very specifically, about the three 'Garden Communities' proposed in north Essex along the A120 designed to deliver longer-term sustainable growth in the latter half of the plan period and beyond 2033. Further work is required to address the Inspector's concerns and the North Essex Authorities are considering how best to proceed.

With more work required to demonstrate the soundness of the Local Plan, its policies cannot yet carry the full weight of adopted policy, however they can carry some weight in the determination of planning applications. The examination of Section 2 of the Local Plan will progress once matters in relation to Section 1 have been resolved. Where emerging policies are particularly relevant to a planning application and can be given some weight in line with the principles set out in paragraph 48 of the NPPF, they will be considered and, where appropriate, referred to in decision notices. In general terms however, more weight will be given to policies in the NPPF and the adopted Local Plan.

5. Officer Appraisal (including Site Description and Proposal)

Application site

The application site is located within the development boundary of St Osyth. It serves a detached bungalow constructed of brick with a tiled roof. The front of the site is partly concreted for parking and partly laid to lawn. The rear has a patio and is then laid to lawn with an existing previously approved single storey rear extension and a previously granted, through Lawful use certificate, side extension. The site boundaries comprise of close boarded fencing.

<u>Proposal</u>

This application seeks planning permission to change an existing, previously granted via a Lawful Use Certification application, side extension roof from flat to pitched.

The proposed materials for the proposed roof will consist of tile to match the existing host dwelling.

Assessment

The main considerations of this application are the design and the impact upon residential amenity.

Policy Considerations

The adopted Tendring District Local Plan (2007) Policies QL9, QL10 and QL11 seek to ensure that all new development makes a positive contribution to the quality of the local environment and protects or enhances local character, and the development will not have a materially damaging impact on the privacy, daylight and other amenities of occupiers of nearby property. Policy SPL3

of the Tendring District Local Plan 2013-2033 and Beyond Publication Draft (June 2017) carries forward the sentiments of these saved policies.

Design and Appearance

The proposal is considered to be of a scale and nature appropriate to the site and the surrounding area. The use of matching materials will blend the development with the host dwelling. Although the development will be publicly visible it will not have any impact upon the street scene as it will be set back from the front boundary by a minimum of 17m.

The proposed pitched roof and eaves will be in line with the existing host dwelling's roof blending the development acceptably. The design of the development overall is considered to be acceptable.

Impact on Residential Amenity

The proposed pitched roof will be hipped away from the neighbouring property 113 Point Clear Road and will be screened by the host dwelling from the dwelling at 117 Point Clear Road. As a consequence, it is considered that there will be no adverse impact on the daylight, privacy or other amenities currently enjoyed by neighbouring properties.

Other Considerations

St Osyth Parish Council has no objection to the planning application. No further letters of representation were received.

Conclusion

It is considered that the proposed development is consistent with the National and Local Plan Policies identified above, and in the absence of any material harm resulting from the development, the application is recommended for approval.
