A.1 PROPOSED NAMING AND NUMBERING

PART 1 – KEY INFORMATION

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

To seek authority to proceed with the formal naming of the road currently under construction on land at “Millets”, Thorpe Road, Weeley, Essex.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A new development of 9 (nine) properties and 1 (one) new road has commenced on the site at the above location. The layout of this development and the proposed postal addresses is shown on the drawing attached as an Appendix to this report.

RECOMMENDATION(S)

(a) That the new road shown on the site plan attached as an Appendix to this report is named “Littlebury Gardens”.

Reason:- The maiden name of the developer’s mother was “Littlebury” along with three other generations who all grew up in Weeley. The mother started and built the scout headquarters and has only recently retired as Assistant District Commissioner in Tendring District Scouts. The developer’s grandmother was a land girl and her great grandfather was part of the Home Guard for Weeley all with the name “Littlebury”.

That all interested parties be advised of the name allocated to the new road.

However, if the Council objects to the proposed names, the person proposing the name may appeal against the objection to a Petty Sessional Court, under Section 17 of the Public Health Act 1925.
