PART 1 – KEY INFORMATION

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

To seek authority to proceed with the formal naming of the existing access road at the junction with Clacton Road and Gutteridge Hall Lane, Weeley, Essex.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A proposal has been put forward to name the existing access road as shown on the plan attached as an appendix to this report.

RECOMMENDATION(S)
