## **Status of the Local Plan**

The 'development plan' for Tendring is the 2007 'adopted' Local Plan. Paragraph 213 of the NPPF (2019) allows local planning authorities to give due weight to adopted albeit outdated policies according to their degree of consistency with the policies in the NPPF. Paragraph 48 of the NPPF also allows weight to be given to policies in emerging plans according to their stage of preparation, the extent to which there are unresolved objections to relevant policies and the degree of consistency with national policy. As of 16th June 2017, the emerging Local Plan for Tendring is the Tendring District Local Plan 2013-2033 and Beyond Publication Draft.

Section 1 of the Local Plan (which sets out the strategy for growth across North Essex including Tendring, Colchester and Braintree) was examined in January and May 2018 and the Inspector's initial findings were published in June 2018. They raise concerns, very specifically, about the three 'Garden Communities' proposed in north Essex along the A120 designed to deliver longer-term sustainable growth in the latter half of the plan period and beyond 2033. Further work is required to address the Inspector's concerns and the North Essex Authorities are considering how best to proceed.

With more work required to demonstrate the soundness of the Local Plan, its policies cannot yet carry the full weight of adopted policy, however they can carry some weight in the determination of planning applications. The examination of Section 2 of the Local Plan will progress once matters in relation to Section 1 have been resolved. Where emerging policies are particularly relevant to a planning application and can be given some weight in line with the principles set out in paragraph 48 of the NPPF, they will be considered and, where appropriate, referred to in decision notices. In general terms however, more weight will be given to policies in the NPPF and the adopted Local Plan.

## 5. Officer Appraisal (including Site Description and Proposal)

#### Proposal

This application seeks permission for the conversion of the existing garage into habitable accommodation.

### Application site

The site is located to the south of Remercie Road, within the development boundary of Mistley. The site serves a two storey semi-detached dwelling. The front of the site is laid to lawn with some shrubbery and a low fence along the neighbouring boundary to the west, there is a paved driveway and an attached garage to the east. The exterior walls are constructed from brick work with a pitched tiled roof. Remercie Road consists of dwellings of a similar design to the application site, other materials are seen along the streetscene such as painted render and boarding.

#### Assessment

#### Design and appearance

One of the core planning principles of The National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) as stated at paragraph 130 is to always seek to secure high quality design. Saved Policies QL9, QL10 and QL11 aim to ensure that all new development makes a positive contribution to the quality of the local environment, relates well to is site and surroundings particularly in relation to its form and design and does not have a materially damaging impact on the amenities of occupiers of nearby properties. Emerging Policy SP1 reflects these considerations.

This application does not propose to extend the existing garage.

The garage is located to the east of the dwelling and is visible from the streetscene. The existing garage door is to be removed and the exterior walls will be constructed from fiber/cement boarding with a 1200 x 1200 window located to the front of the site. The use of boarding is a contrasting material to that of the original dwelling however it is visible within the streetscene and is not deemed to cause any adverse effects to the visual amenities of the area.

Impacts to neighbouring amenities

The NPPF, Paragraph 17, states that planning should always seek to secure a good standard of amenity for all existing and future occupants of land and buildings. In addition, Policy QL11 of the saved plan states that amongst criteria 'development will only be permitted if the development will not have a materially damaging impact on the privacy, daylight or other amenities of occupiers of nearby properties'. These sentiments are carried forward in Policy SPL3 of the Tendring District Local Plan 2013-2033 and Beyond Publication Draft (June 2017).

This proposal is deemed to have no significant impact on loss of privacy, daylight or harm to the amenities of the adjacent neighbours.

Highway issues

This proposal does affect the existing car parking arrangements due to the loss of garage space, the existing parking space to the east of the dwelling will remain and an additional parking space on front garden is proposed. It is deemed that the parking provisions at the site are appropriate.

Other considerations

Mistley Parish Council supports this application.

No other letters of representation have been received.

Conclusion

It is considered that the proposed development is consistent with the National and Local Plan Policies identified above. In the absence of material harm resulting from the proposal the application is recommended for approval.
