



## Record of Officer's Decision

The Openness of Local Government Bodies Regulations 2014 and the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012

Decision Made:	That Councillor Overton's reason (namely illness) for non-attendance at meetings of the Council be approved in the event of her not attending a meeting before 7 April 2020.
Reason for Decision (if a report was produced to support the Decision, refer to or attach it):	In order to prevent Councillor Nicola Overton becoming disqualified from the office of Councillor given that the meeting of the Full Council due to have been held on 31 March 2020 was cancelled as a result of the Covid-19 public health emergency. 39 (out of 48) Members responded to the consultation,

and of those, the vast majority (92.3%) supported approving Councillor Overton's reason for non-attendance and no Councillors stated that they were not in favour. 9 Councillors either did not respond and so expressed no opinion or responded but indicated that they wished to abstain.

This proposed decision was also discussed at the Group Leaders' meeting held on 20 March 2020 and there was no objection voiced.

Councillor Overton's GP has certified that she is ill and that this illness is at a level where she is unfit to work for at least 11 weeks. This will be the case up until 30 April 2020 at the earliest.

Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:

## Legal

If a Councillor does not attend any meeting of the Council (or any of its Committees or Sub-Committees) for a consecutive period of six months, Section 85 of Part V of the Local Government Act 1972 disqualifies them unless the Full Council approves the reason for non-attendance before the end of that period.

Research has been undertaken into the suitability of using the delegated urgency provisions for Section 85 and it is considered reasonable to do so in the current circumstances. All Group Leaders were consulted on this approach and happy with the business continuity arrangements being proposed.

Section 78 of the Coronavirus Act 2020 (c.7) authorises (in England) the Secretary of State to introduce Regulations (made by Statutory Instrument) that, in relation to local authority meetings to be held, or held, before 7 May 2021, may make provisions relating to when, where and the manner in which local authority meetings can be held (including 'virtually'). The Secretary of State may also by Regulation disapply, modify, or make different or supplementary provisions of any local government law that pertains to local authority meetings. At the time of this decision no Regulations had been made.

Given the current timescale the Council has to make a decision on Councillor Overton prior to the Regulations being made and coming into force, otherwise the disqualification of Councillor Overton is automatic.

	<u>Financial</u>
	Allowing Councillor Overton to become disqualified from office would lead to a vacancy on the Council. Any saving from a reduction in Members' Allowances payments would be more than offset by the cost of administering the subsequent By-Election (and the timing of this would be uncertain given the same Covid-19 emergency).
	Equality and Reputational
	It would be personally unfair to Councillor Overton to allow her to lose her seat on the Council in such circumstances and the Council would run the risk of public criticism for allowing it to happen given that it had a mechanism available with which to prevent it happening.
