STATEMENT OF REASON

An application to divert the footpath was made in respect of planning granted by Tendring District Council Planning under application no. 19/01472/FUL approved 12.12.19.

The site is a wedding venue and it is proposed to divert a section of Footpath 20 to facilitate proposed new holiday accommodation and amendments to use of former workshop building previously approved for holiday accommodation.

The new route will run along an existing farm track, excepting at its start by Oakley Road where it will cross a culvert (to be installed) via a gap to the side of a gate (to be installed). The gap will be 1.1m wide to comply with the revised British Standards for Gaps, Gates and Stiles.

The proposed Order includes the required width of two metres for the new section of the path excepting the above-mentioned limitation.

The Applicant will defray all costs associated with the diversion.

It is considered that the diversion satisfies the requirements of the Town and Country Planning Act in all respects.

An informal consultation has been undertaken dated 30 June 2020 including all Statutory consultees as required by the 1993 Public Path Order Regulations and other interested user groups and Statutory Undertakers. No objections were received.
