Decision Made:	The additional funding is required for a partnership Police Community Support Officer. The Officer will be be funded by a joint agreement between Tendring District Council and Harwich Town Council, for a period of two years commencing on 01.04.2021. It is intended that the Councils will fund the provision of one (1) additional Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) in the Harwich and surrounding areas.

	 The Chief Constable is willing to provide the additional PCSO and the Police and Crime Commissioner for Essex supports the arrangement. The Parties have agreed that the service shall be provided on the terms and conditions of an agreement. Objectives for the Funded PCSO: Be integrated into a local (Harwich) Community Policing Team. Spend the majority of their time within neighbourhoods and not be office/police station based and/or undertaking administrative roles (unless restricted by injury or welfare). Undertake public facing duties in uniform. Be visible in the communities on uniformed, foot or cycle patrol. Deal with anti-social behaviour (ASB), low level crime and incidents and local problems/priorities and quality of life issues. Support and improve service to victims and vulnerable people in the community. Conduct engagement and problem-solving activity. Patrol hot spots identified through intelligence and tasking & coordination processes. Support partnership work. Have regard to each Council's aims and objectives in their daily work.
Reason for Decision (if a report was produced to support the Decision, refer to or attach it):	 a. The Parties have identified a collective desire to fund, monitor and work in partnership the additional PCSO in the Harwich area. b.Tendring District Council had a section in the Proposed Adjustments to the Budget December 2020 and the section of the report is attached. The wording in the report is: "The Council currently supports the cost of this officer by way of a 50% contribution that is matched by Harwich Town Council. The initial 2 year period under the current arrangement comes to an end at the end of March 2021 - it is proposed to continue to support this post for a further 2 years.
