# **PURPOSE OF THE REPORT**

To seek authority to proceed with the formal naming of the road currently under construction on Great Bentley, Land off Plough Road, Essex.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

A new development of initially 25 properties and 3 new roads has commenced on the site at the above location. The layout of this development is shown on the drawing attached as an Appendix to this report.

# **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

- (a) That the new roads shown on the site plan attached as an Appendix to this report are named:
- "Cinderpath Way" A path across the farm used by locals was known as the cinder path.
- "Margery Mitchell Way" Margery Mitchell was the owner of St Mary's Farm her husband has a street named after him in another part of the Village.
- "St Mary's Green" This is in recognition of the fact that the land used to be a farm known as St Mary's Farm and is to keep the name in line with other new developments in the village (i.e. Admiral's Green)

That all interested parties be advised of the name allocated to the new road.
