PART 1 – KEY INFORMATION

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

To seek authority to proceed with the formal naming of the road currently under construction on land off Holland Road, Lt Clacton, Essex.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A new development of 8 properties and one new road, has commenced on the site at the above location. The layout of this development and the proposed numbering is shown on the drawing attached as an Appendix to this report.

RECOMMENDATION(S)

- (a) That the new road shown on the site plan attached as an Appendix to this report is named “Whitegates Court”.**
- (b) That all interested parties be advised of the name allocated to the new road.**
