PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

To agree the final carry forward amounts requested by Departments at the end of 2021/22.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- As part of the 2021/22 Outturn Report considered by Cabinet on 15 July 2022, carry forwards totalling £17,890,790 were requested by Departments.
- In light of the challenging financial position faced by the Council in 2022/23 and beyond, all of the requested carry forwards were reviewed in consultation with Departments.
- Following this review, carry forwards totalling £336,980 have either been withdrawn by Departments or are not recommended for approval.
- The total of £336,980 highlighted above is therefore available to support the Council's financial position in 2022/23.
- Carry forwards totalling £17,553,810 are therefore proposed to be approved as set out in the recommendations below.

RECOMMENDATION(S)

That Carry Forwards from 2021/22 totalling £17,553,810 as set out in this report and appendices are approved.

REASON(S) FOR THE RECOMMENDATION(S)

To finalise the budget amounts carried forward at the end of 2021/22 as part of the wider financial outturn process.

BACKGROUND AND PROPOSED CARRYFORWARDS FROM 2021/22

On the 15 July 2022, Cabinet considered the Outturn Report for 2021/22, which included carry forwards totalling £17,890,790, with a high level summary set out within the table below:

All carry forwards requested by services (as set out in the table above) were reflected in the year end position for 2021/22 that was considered by Cabinet on 15 July 2022, and included 'qualifying' and 'non-qualifying' items.

In terms of 'qualifying' items, these reflect the following broad principles:

- There is a 'contractual commitment':
- There is a related long term project which is expected to span a number of financial years;
- There is non-recurring item for which no budget provision exists in the following year;

In terms of 'non-qualifying' carry forwards, these relate to items that may support initiatives and projects that although not strictly complying with the above criteria, it could be advantageous for them to be agreed as they further the delivery of priorities etc.

As set out in the report to Cabinet on 15 July 2022, in light of the challenging financial position faced by the Council in 2022/23 and beyond, all of the requested carry forwards were reviewed in consultation with Departments. The review was in the context of where items could be 'avoided', where there were only limited consequences or where they could be considered in future as part of the Corporate Investment Plan approach.

The report to Cabinet on 15 July 2022 also delegated the approval of the carry forwards to the S151 Officer in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Corporate Finance and Governance.

Following a review of the carry forwards highlighted above, a summary of the proposed position is as follows:
