Status of the Local Plan

Planning law requires that decisions on applications must be taken in accordance with the development plan unless there are material considerations that indicate otherwise (Section 70(2) of the 1990 Town and Country Planning Act and Section 38(6) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004). This is set out in Paragraph 2 of the National Planning Policy Framework (the Framework). The 'development plan' for Tendring comprises, in part, Sections 1 and 2 of the Tendring District Council 2013-33 and Beyond Local Plan (adopted January 2021 and January 2022, respectively), together with any neighbourhood plans that have been brought into force.

5. Officer Appraisal (including Site Description and Proposal)

Application Site

The application site comprises of a two-storey dwelling with a first-floor link attached to the neighbouring property. The house is set back on its plot with parking to the front and side and garage to the rear.

The site is located within the development boundary on a recently constructed estate.

Proposal

This application seeks planning permission for the erection of a single storey rear extension.

Assessment

Design and Appearance

The proposal will be sited to the rear of the house and largely screened by the host dwelling and existing garage. There will be some views of the proposal achieved from Forrester Road through the car port, however these views will be minimal due to the set back of the extension from the front boundary and will not to be detrimental to the appearance/ character of the existing house or streetscene.

The proposed addition is of a suitable size and design in relation to the main house and will be finished in materials which are consistent with such.

The site is of a suitable size to accommodate the proposal and still retain a usable area of private amenity space.

Impact to Neighbours

The proposed extension will be single storey in design, will be set off the shared boundaries and will be predominantly screened by the existing garages and boundary fencing preventing a significant loss of amenities to neighbouring sites.

Other Considerations

Mistley Parish Council raised no objections to this application.

There have been no letters of representation received.

Conclusion

In the absence of material harm resulting from the proposed development the application is recommended for approval.

7. Conditions / Reasons for Refusal

1. COMPLIANCE REQUIRED: COMMENCEMENT TIME LIMIT

CONDITION: The works to which this consent relate must be begun not later than the expiration of three years beginning with the date of this consent.

REASON: To comply with the requirements of Section 18(1) of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by Section 51 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004

NOTE/S FOR CONDITION:

The development needs to commence within the timeframe provided. Failure to comply with this condition will result in the consent becoming lapsed and unable to be carried out. If commencement takes place after the time lapses this may result in unlawful works at risk of both Enforcement Action and Criminal proceedings. You should only commence works when all other conditions requiring agreement prior to commencement have been complied with.

2. APPROVED PLANS & DOCUMENTS

CONDITION: The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the drawings/documents listed below and/or such other drawings/documents as may be approved by the Local Planning Authority in writing pursuant to other conditions of this permission or such drawings/documents as may subsequently be approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority as a non-material amendment following an application in that regard (except for Listed Building Consents).
