Status of the Local Plan

Planning law requires that decisions on applications must be taken in accordance with the development plan unless there are material considerations that indicate otherwise (Section 70(2) of the 1990 Town and Country Planning Act and Section 38(6) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004). This is set out in Paragraph 2 of the National Planning Policy Framework (the Framework). The 'development plan' for Tendring comprises, in part, Sections 1 and 2 of the Tendring District Council 2013-33 and Beyond Local Plan (adopted January 2021 and January 2022, respectively), together with any neighbourhood plans that have been brought into force.

5. Officer Appraisal (including Site Description and Proposal)

Proposal

This application seeks permission for the erection of a garden room

Assessment

Design and Appearance

The proposed garden room will be located to the rear of the site and is not visible from the public views of the streetscene.

The garden room is of a single storey nature, due to the roof pitch it will have a maximum height of 4.4 metres to the front, reducing to 3 metres at the rear, immediately adjacent to the rear boundary. The garden room will be finished in Grey fibre cement weatherboarding with anthracite aluminium windows and doors, the windows on the rear elevation will be obscure glazed. The roof incorporates the installation of 8 solar / PV panels. The proposal is considered to be of an acceptable design and appearance with no significant harmful impacts on visual amenities.

Impacts on Neighbouring Amenities.

The proposal is of a single storey nature and therefore poses no significant threat to overlooking or loss of privacy to the adjacent neighbouring dwellings. The windows located on the rear elevation will be obscure glazed as to lessen any potential impact on the loss of privacy.

The proposed garden room is located an adequate enough distance from the neighbouring dwellings as to have no impact on the loss of light.

Renewable Energy Generation and Energy Efficiency Measures

Chapter 14 of the NPPF supports the transition to a low carbon future in a changing climate. Policy PPL 10 of the Local Plan supports proposals for renewable energy schemes giving due consideration to their scale, impact and the amount of energy which is to be generated. The installation of the solar panels will provide a renewable energy source for the applicants own use, which is to be encouraged and is in line with the objectives of Policy PPL 10.

Other considerations

Clacton is non-parished and therefore no comments are required.

No other letters of representation have been received.

Conclusion

The proposal is considered to comply with the aforementioned National and Local Policies. In the absence of material harm the proposal is recommended for approval.

1 COMPLIANCE REQUIRED: COMMENCEMENT TIME LIMIT

CONDITION: The development hereby permitted shall be begun not later the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.

REASON: To comply with the requirements of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as amended by Section 51 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.
