A.1 PROPOSED NAMING AND NUMBERING

PART 1 – KEY INFORMATION

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

To seek authority to proceed with the formal naming of the roads currently under construction Former Chicken Farm site, Thorpe Road, Little Clacton, Essex.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A new development of 81 properties and 2 new roads has commenced on the site at the above location. The layout of this development is shown on the drawing attached as an Appendix to this report.

RECOMMENDATION(S)

(a) That the new roads shown on the site plan attached as an Appendix to this report are named: - “Parkgate Corner” and “Bloomfield Road”.

(b)

Reason: -

Parkgate Corner- This reflects the original status of the land prior to purchase. The ordinance survey maps show and record this area as being Parkgate Corner and it is easy for the local continuity.

Bloomfield Road- In memory of Sgt D Bloomfield, a local officer who gave his life during World War 2.

That all interested parties be advised of the names allocated to the new roads.

to name a street which is not already named. However, if the Council objects to the proposed names, the person proposing the name may appeal against the objection to a Petty Sessional Court, under Section 17 of the Public Health Act 1925.
