Part 3, Schedule 3 – Delegation of Executive Functions delegated to Officers paragraph 4.4 (1) With the exception of the matters which the Leader of the Council has determined are to be discharged by the Cabinet or individual Portfolio Holders, as detailed in the Cabinet Scheme of Delegation, the Chief Executive and the Corporate Directors have delegated authority to discharge all executive functions within their respective service areas as set out in Article 12, having authority to act on all such matters. The Chief Executive shall determine from time to time what the service responsibilities of the Deputy Chief Executive and each Corporate Director and Head of Service shall be. (2). The delegation of powers to officers is underpinned by the principle and culture of consultation and liaison with Members, as appropriate and the ability for officers to refer matters to the relevant decision maker i.e. individual Portfolio Holder or a meeting of the full Cabinet, where it is felt that this is appropriate due to the nature of an issue

To procure an advice note from Rapleys & HDH Planning on the likely Housing Requirement for the Local Plan review and apply an exemption to the procurement process for the following reasons. 	In respect of (e), the work is of a specialist nature, and many planning consultancies with expertise in the relevant field(s) act for private developers and landowners with an interest in (and history of) arguing against local planning authorities to increase housing requirements in Local Plan. The consultants employed by the Council previously to advise on housing need are not conflicted in this manner; already have an in-depth understanding of the specific demographic and economic factors affecting Tendring that have informed the calculation of objectively-assessed housing requirements in this manner; and are therefore best placed to carry out this work in an effective and timely manner. The consultancies the Council would have sought separate quotes from happen to work together on matters such as this and have provided a combined proposal.
Reason for Decision (if a report was produced to support the Decision, refer to or attach it):	The Council is required to understand housing needs for the extended Local Plan period and to fully explore the avenues that might justify the exceptional approach of departing from the Standard Methodology set out in government guidance.
	Due to the sensitivities around this piece of work, it is imperative to award this work to a company without a conflicting interest and with a knowledge of the unique demographic and economic factors that have influenced objectively-assessed housing need calculations previously.

Details of any Alternative Options Considered and rejected (together with reasons):	 Do nothing. The Council would have to accept the application of the government's Standard Method for calculating local housing need without exploring whether or not there could be any exceptional justification (as allowed in current national planning policy) for applying an alternative method. Furthermore, if an alternative method could be justified, the Council will face challenges when defending its approach to future housing growth when the Local Plan is examined by a Government Inspector – if not based on clear and robust evidence.
