7. Officer Appraisal (including Site Description and Proposal)

Application Site

The application site known as Halfpenny Pier, consists of several buildings located on the pier which is to the North West of The Quay. The buildings on the pier include Listed Building 1298465 – Premises of Orwell and Harwich Navigation to the West, as well as a café and office / shower block to the East. The proposed Water Bottle Refill Station will be located outside of the office / shower block on Halfpenny Pier. It will be bolted to the floor and accessible 24 hours a day. The site is outside the Settlement Development Boundary, within Harwich Conservation Area, Historic Towns and Flood Zones 2 and 3.

Proposal

The application seeks planning permission for the proposed installation of a water bottle refill station for members of the public.

<u>Assessment</u>

Visual Impact

The proposed water bottle refill station is to be located on the Halfpenny Pier outside of the current office / shower block building. It will be clearly visible from the street scene of The Quay. The water bottle refill station will be dark blue in colour which will be sympathetic to the surroundings and blend well with existing buildings on the Pier. The proposal will not have a significant impact on the street scene.

Heritage Impact

The proposed water refill station is located in close proximity to Grade II Listed Building 1298465 – Premises of Orwell and Harwich Navigation Company.

Policy PPL9 of the Tendring District Local Plan 2013-2033 and Beyond Section 1 states that proposals for new development affecting a listed building or its setting will only be permitted where they will protect its special architectural or historic interest, its character, appearance and fabric, although the Plan recognises that the scope for a listed building to adapt to modern life and requirements will itself depend upon a number of considerations and it will not always be possible to incorporate modern design solutions without also causing harm to its special character fabric, or appearance.

Essex County Council Heritage have been consulted on this application and have raised no objections.

TDLP Policy PPL8 confirms new development within conservation areas will only be permitted where it has regard to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the special character and appearance of the area, especially in terms of scale and design, and materials. The proposed water bottle refill station is a minor proposal, and the dark blue colour would preserve the special character and appearance of the Conservation Area.

Impact to Neighbours

The small scale of the development would not result in any loss of light or amenity to the neighbouring properties. The location is deemed suitable as it is accessible to the public and does not prevent access to the pier or other properties.

Ecology and Biodiversity

General duty on all authorities

The Natural Environment and Rural Communities Act 2006 amended by the Environment Act 2021 provides under Section 40 the general duty to conserve and enhance biodiversity: "For the purposes of this section "the general biodiversity objective" is the conservation and enhancement of biodiversity in England through the exercise of functions in relation to England." Section 40 states authorities must consider what actions they can take to further the general biodiversity objective and determine policies and specific objectives to achieve this goal. The actions mentioned include conserving, restoring, or enhancing populations of particular species and habitats. In conclusion for decision making, it is considered that the Local Planning Authority must be satisfied that the development would conserve and enhance.

This development is subject to the general duty outlined above. An informative has been imposed strongly encouraging the applicant to improve the biodiversity of the application site through appropriate additional planting and wildlife friendly features. Therefore, the development on balance, with consideration of the impact of the development and baseline situation on site, is considered likely to conserve and enhance biodiversity interests.

Biodiversity net gain

Biodiversity net gain (BNG) is an approach that aims to leave the natural environment in a measurably better state than it was beforehand. This excludes applications for Listed Building Consent, Advert Consent, Reserved Matters, Prior Approvals, Lawful Development Certificates, householders, self builds, and other types of application which are below the threshold i.e. does not impact a priority habitat and impacts less than 25 sq.m of habitat, or 5m of linear habitats such as hedgerow). This proposal is minor and would not result in any loss of habitat, as such the development is not applicable for Biodiversity Net Gain.

Protected Species

In accordance with Natural England's standing advice the proposed development site and surrounding habitat have been assessed for potential impacts on protected species. It is considered that the proposal is unlikely to adversely impact upon protected species or habitats.

Conclusion

In accordance with the overarching duty outlined above, this development is considered to accord to best practice, policy, and legislation requirements in consideration of the impacts on ecology interests.

Other Considerations

Harwich Town Council have submitted no objections to the application. No other letters of representation have been received.

Conclusion

The proposed development is consistent with the above mentioned national and local planning policies. In the absence of material harm, the proposal is recommended for approval.
