targeting our ageing population in Tendring to build strength and balance, reducing the risk of future falls and to aid with rehabilitation.

Funding of £70,000 was awarded:

£65,000 for the installation and supply of equipment £3,000 towards the cost of ongoing maintenance £2,000 towards gym activation.

A report went to Management Team outlining the acceptance of funding and to progress the project from Sport England and subsequent installation of the Active Outdoor Gym on 17<sup>th</sup> October 2023.

Following a report to Management Team on 17th October 2023, concurrences were sought from the then Portfolio Holder for Partnerships and the Portfolio Holder for Environment & Public Space, to accept the funding, and an officer decision was published on 7th December 2023.

Following procurement rules, with advice from the procurement team at Essex County Council, an open tender process was followed. As a result, the contract is to be awarded to Kompan Ltd for the sum of £64,999.99.

Concurrence to award the contract to Kompan Ltd has now been sought from Cllr Placey and Cllr Barry.

That the costs increase above the agreed amount once work is underway. This can be avoided by regular discussions with the contractor and making alterations to ensure the project remains within budget.

Not to accept the award of funding and leave the area without the outdoor gym. As the gym is fully funded by Sport England and as Tendring has an ageing population, at increased risk of falls, the installation of the gym will be a positive asset.
