Decision Made:	To grant a licence permitting a production from the National Film and TV School to use the former council offices at Weeley as a location.
Reason for Decision (if a report was produced to	Tendring District Council, as part its Memorandum of Understanding with Creative UK, supports production filming within the district as being of wider benefit to

the local economy; this aligns with the adopted Creative and Cultural Strategy.

As an example, this production is seeking to use local services (accommodation and cleaners being two examples) and is using local businesses while engaging in research (such as eateries).

In coming to decisions in relation to management of assets, the Council must act in accordance with its statutory duties and responsibilities. Cases assessing principles of Section 120 of Local Government Act 1972 confirm that the Council is obliged to ensure that the management of its assets are for the benefit of the District. Awarding this licence provides for best use of a Council asset, bringing it into use and providing economic advantage for the council – particularly, use of this building for the assigned licence period will provide a contribution towards the cost of the empty property and enable TDC to apply for a further period of NNDR empty property rate relief once vacated.

## Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:

Legal: A standard form of the council's licence agreement is being used to ensure the authority has the appropriate legal protections in place.

Equality: N/A in this matter

Finance: There is a small amount of income to the council to cover the standard costs of issuing the appropriate licence and associated officer time. There is far greater benefit in the business rates relief applicable from bringing an empty site back into use for a period of time, which provides a saving to the authority.

Risk: There is a small risk of damage to the property as a result of filming, but this is adequately mitigated by the licence agreement, and the requirement of the production to have its own appropriate insurance in place along with a risk assessment which is required from the company as part of the application.

It should be noted that this decision will not impact upon other decision-making processes around longterm disposal of the Weeley site.

Not to grant a licence – this was rejected because it does not support the financial position of the council, and is counter to the council's approach to support the creative arts industry within the district (and its knock-on effect for the local economy).
