I am concerned this application is asking for extended
hours until 11pm which I feel will create a serious issue
for nearby residents including myself and my family.

I would add that the noise level previously agreed in the
January 2024 variation has been exceeded whenever
previous outdoor entertainment has taken place,
although granted this has ceased before 19.00hrs

The condition that speakers point inwards into the park is
quiet frankly laughable and shows a complete lack of
understanding of how sound propagates.

Good afternoon,

I am writing to express my objections to the proposed change to Licensed Activities at Highfield Grange Holiday Park.

I am a resident of [REDACTED] & my house is directly behind the holiday park. I have been advised that Highfield Grange are hoping to extend their outdoor entertainment to Monday - Sunday 11am to 11pm.

I have strong objections to the proposed change. This will be extremely disruptive for residents. The levels of noise from Highfield Grange inside entertainment is already beyond what I consider reasonable levels. I work for [REDACTED] & have to get up early each day for work. My sleep is already disturbed due to existing noise from Highfield Grange & I feel that an extension to the licence will be of further detriment to my wellbeing.

In addition, neighbours in surrounding streets have not received sufficient notification from Highfield Grange as required notices have not been posted in clear locations. They have therefore been denied suitable opportunity to provide their feedback & any objections they may have.

Good Afternoon

Thank you for your email.

Under the Licensing Act 2003 (the act), there is no strict statutory requirement for applicants to write directly to residents to notify them of a new premises licence application or a variation.

The Act relies on a system of public notices to inform the community.

The applicant must display a pale blue notice on the premises, clearly visible from the outside, for a period of no less than 28 consecutive days starting from the day after the application is submitted.

The applicant must advertise the application in a local newspaper or similar local publication (such as a newsletter) at least once within 10 working days of the application being accepted.

However, I have passed your comments onto the applicant and their solicitor should they wish to comment or make alternative arrangements for communication.
