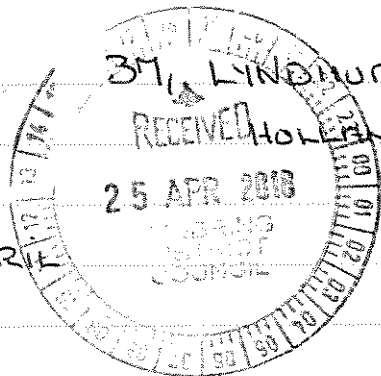

I, the undersigned, hereby oppose the Holland Football Club's pending application for an entertainment license, including late-night music and the sale of alcohol on and off the premises.

The original plans anticipated a clubhouse and changing rooms for children's football. Now, however, the plan is to establish what is essentially a late-night club, serving alcohol from 11am to 2am, and playing live music. The clubhouse is in a quiet residential area, surrounded by family homes. The noise and commotion of the proposed late-night club will undoubtedly travel and cause disturbance in the surrounding neighbourhood. The previous clubhouse was similarly disruptive on event nights. I do not believe that the request to the council has given consideration to the local residents, and I oppose the Holland Football Club's application for an entertainment license.

I write in connection with the above planning application to strongly object and put forward a case so that a happy and sensible medium can be reached.

My husband and I were the first to move into this new development of Gainsford Gardens, back in November 2016. We have watched the development grow including the fab new football club house and when the planned pitches are complete, how wonderful for the area. Anything to keep youngsters safe, encourage them to enjoy competition and being with peers and to keep fit can only be welcomed. Obviously we were aware of these plans and our four young grandchildren regularly go over to the playing ground.

But,

We are horrified to see the application requesting that alcohol be served nightly up until midnight during the week and up to 2.00a.m. at the weekend. This is so extreme and seems very unfair to all the neighbours in the nearby area. Noise, music, alcohol induced unacceptable actions affecting all the local residents.

The huge car park has frighteningly increased to the former one. Use of outside areas i.e. patio, should normally cease at 21.00 hrs as recommended by the British & Beer & Pub Association. It will be an issue late at night or early hours of the morning with noisy voices, slamming of doors... cars revving etc. Most unfair.

Surely the Planning officer and Committee will not allow a full blown pub/club-holding social functions - near the peaceful environment that we choose to live near.

Should this license be granted:

- property will be devalued
- Property will be damaged
- litter thrown around the roads and in residents gardens
- Increase of bad language and unsociable behaviour
- Youngsters will be tempted to drink more alcohol - In a world of addictions, obesity etc. More thought must be given to these times being applied for
- Increase of traffic

As a resident of Lyndhurst Road, Holland on Sea, I would like to strongly oppose the application for the above licence for the following reasons;

Increased traffic on roads leading to venue - most probably Lyndhurst Road as the closest off of seafront.  
Noise pollution (football games themselves are bad enough with the foul language you can constantly here) caused by late night music and parties. This will disrupt sleep for those who have to get up at 5am like my husband and many others in the street.  
Late night pedestrians who will inevitably be intoxicated and therefore loud and disrespectful. Possible damage to residents property.  
Cars leaving late at night, again, disrupting sleep and adding noise and air pollution.  
Possibility of drink driving around connecting roads with the potential of road traffic accidents or again, damage to property.
